Granting a scholarship gives purpose to fundraising for garden clubs. As an educational non-profit enriching the educational opportunities of local youth renders creditability to our cause.

Keep a record of your scholarship recipients. Your local high school will provide contact information upon request for the purpose of follow-up to continue offering financial assistance. Your club can grant a scholarship to the same student year after year to help them complete their college education.

The Washington Post reports that 40% of college freshmen drop out. Knowing that funds continue to be available can be the encouragement needed to stay in college.

Forms are available from this Chairman to customize for your garden club. Establish the criteria for continued scholarship such as: full-time student with 12 unites or more; GPA of 2.5 - 3.5 or above; part-time work that must be verified by the employer.

Studies show that students who work part-time may not get the highest grade, but they establish higher career success after college.
